

OPERATION OF GOLF CARTS AND LOW-SPEED VEHICLES IN EAGLE HARBOR

Eagle Harbor is one of the few communities in Clay County that are fortunate enough to be approved for Golf Cart use on the roads of our community. While this is one of several wonderful amenities that we enjoy, it is very important that laws that govern the use of golf carts be followed in order to maintain resident safety. Many of the laws can be found in Florida Statute 316.212.

A common misperception of a Golf Cart is that due to its low speed, it is a relatively safe vehicle. However, when operated outside of the laws, it can present hazardous conditions that may result in serious injury.

There are approximately 13,000 Golf Cart related accidents per year that require emergency room visits.

Approximately 40% of those accidents involve children under the age of 16 and half of those are due to a fall from a moving cart. It is also very important to be cautious when turning left in a Golf Cart as this is when the vast majority of Golf Cart accidents take place.

Some of the laws relating to golf cart use found in FS 316.212 are as follows:

- 1.) A Golf Cart cannot exceed 20 miles per hour.
- 2.) Golf Carts can only be operated on designated roads where the speed limit is 30 miles per hour or less.
 - 3.) Drivers must be 14 years or older.
 - 4.) Golf Carts can only be operated from sunrise to sunset.
 - 5.) Golf Carts cannot be driven on any sidewalks.
- 6.) Golf Carts must be equipped with sufficient brakes, reliable steering apparatus, safe tires, a rearview mirror, and red reflector warning devices on both the front and rear.
 - 7.) Operators can be arrested for DUI on a Golf Cart.
- 8.) Operators can receive a citation against their driver's license (or future driver's license) for violation of Florida Statute 316.212.

If your golf cart goes more than 20 miles per hour, it is no longer classified as a "Golf Cart," but is classified as a "Low Speed Vehicle (LSV)".

According to Florida State Statutes, Low Speed Vehicles operate under a different set of rules than do Golf Carts. For Example:

- different set of rules than do Golf Carts. For Example:
 1.) Any person operating a Low Speed Vehicle must have in his or her possession a valid driver's license.
 - 2.) Low Speed Vehicles must be equipped with head lamps, stop lamps, turn

signal lamps, tail lamps, reflex reflectors, parking brakes, rearview mirrors, windshields, seat belts, and vehicle identification numbers.

- 3.) Low Speed Vehicles must be registered and insured.
- 4.) Low Speed Vehicles may not exceed 25 miles per hour.
- 5.) Low Speed Vehicles can only be operated on designated roads with posted speed limits of 35 miles per hour or less.
 - 6.) Low Speed Vehicles cannot be driven on any sidewalks.
 - 7.) Operators can be arrested for DUI on a Low Speed Vehicle.
- 8.) Operators can receive a citation against their driver's license for violation of Florida Statute 316.2122.

In addition to the Golf Cart and LSV Florida laws, the CDD requires that all Golf Carts and Low Speed Vehicles register with Eagle Harbor prior to operating on District property.

Registration is free and can be done by making an appointment at (904) 621-8362

Upon completing your registration, you will receive two number decals to adhere to the front and back of your vehicle. Low Speed Vehicles will receive different color decals. A copy of your current Eagle Harbor registration must always be on file.

Failure to register may result in suspension of user privileges of the facilities and amenities.

FROM THE CLAY COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

It's still cold outside, but you may be starting to plan this year's vacation. Include a phone call to the Sheriff's office in your plans. CCSO has a Vacation Watch Program that will have a deputy sheriff stop by frequently and check on your residence during your absence to make sure everything is secure and safe. To enroll in the Vacation Watch Program call the Sheriff's Dispatch Office at (904) 264-6512. Remember to stop your newspaper subscription and put your mail delivery on hold. Newspapers accumulating in the drive way and a mailbox that is crammed with mail are signals to a burglar that you're away. If one you see newspapers stacking up in the neighbor's driveway please pick them up and store them out of sight. This is a simple way to prevent crime.

Another program that is provided by the CCSO is Elder Watch. If you have a elderly relative who requires someone to check on them and you are going to be away for awhile or you are aware of an elderly person who doesn't have a local support person, contact the Sheriff's Dispatch office at (904) 264-6512 and they will have a Deputy stop by or at least call daily to make sure everything is alright.

CCSO CRIME WATCH

VIPS-Patrol Summary

VIPS stands for Volunteers in Police Services. It's a formal Neighborhood Crime Watch program under the supervision of the Clay County Sheriff's Office (CCSO). Since law enforcement can't be everywhere at once, our VIPS volunteers attempt to fill the gaps, and have direct radio access to the Clay County Sheriff's Office Dispatcher while on patrol if a Deputy's response is required.

During the November daily patrols through the Eagle Harbor neighborhoods, (Neighborhoods north of CR 220 and west of US 17) we noticed a total of 279 Garage doors open and unattended. Every garage door open is an invitation to theft, and fortunately there were no thefts from homes reported by Eagle Harbor residents to the Sheriff's Office. We will continue to leave notices in the newsletter/ advertisement boxes of the homes where we see unattended open Garage Doors to remind those residents to close the garage door. We would ask that if you see your neighbor's garage door open, call or ring their bell to remind them to close it. Better to be safe than sorry. Let's work together this like more information contact the Eagle Harbor VIPS New Year to keep our neighborhoods safe and secure.

If we see newspapers piling up in a driveway while we're on patrol, the VIPS volunteers will stop and gather the papers and place them in inconspicuous place on the property. Please

do the same if you see this on a neighbor's driveway. Let's help each other out and reduce the opportunity for crime in Eagle Harbor.

Theft from vehicles continues to be a common property crime reported to the Sheriff's Office and almost without exception the vehicles were unlocked. When you are out shopping or leaving your vehicle unattended at home, secure your vehicle and do not leave packages or property in your vehicles where they are visible. There were two instances of thefts from unlocked vehicles in the Winn Dixie and Wal-Mart lots off of CR 220. If these vehicles were locked these thefts could probably been avoided.

The garage door opener in an unlocked car in your driveway is the same as leaving your garage door open and could provide a prowler easy access to your home. The VIPS goal is to deter crime and inform our residents about what is happening in the neighborhood and surrounding areas and how to prevent crimes. The Sheriff says, "If you like it lock it".

We are always looking for volunteers to help and if you'd coordinator Walt Joba at: waltjoba@comcast.net Volunteer opportunities are not limited to patrolling the neighborhood, but include varied duties such as marine patrol, Crime newsletter, filing reports at the jail, and working in the various units that comprise the sheriff's office.

Tennis Tip

Lately, I have had a lot of players ask me, "How do you win close matches?" This is an excellent question which is surprisingly often overlooked. There are two strategies you can use to win close matches.

The first mistake is playing not to lose or not to miss, particularly late in a set or match. If you lead a match by a set and 4-2, you may find yourself thinking that playing it safe is a good idea since the end of the match is close. If you're playing capable opponents this can backfire and result in your opponent making up their deficit in the match.

If you're already leading a match by a set and 4-2, you probably had an effective strategy that helped you gain the lead. By changing your strategy and simply presenting the ball to your opponent and becoming reactive, you give your opponent a chance to win. You should try and identify why you are up in the match, and continue to use these strategies to close out the match or until your opponent makes an adjustment to counter your strategy.

The second mistake is going for an outright winning shot.


Players tend to do this because they are nervous and want to get the situation over as soon as possible. This is the wrong approach. Before big points you want to try to calm your nerves and, again, focus on what has gotten you to that point. Think about the most common way you have won points so far in the match.

Try not to think, "one more point." Instead, focus on execution or the best strategy available until the match is over. Using this thought process in tiebreakers is also important. In tiebreakers there isn't room to be too conservative or too aggressive. It should be quality point after quality point. If you are able to apply this thinking to your matches, you will start to turn many of the close ones









United States Tennis Association (USTA) league tennis is off and running! These are leagues that allow players to be the most competitive tennis player at their level of play. If your team wins at the local level they then have a chance to compete at the state level. If your team is good enough (maybe slightly lucky) to win at the state tournament then you move on to every competitive tennis player's dream..... NATIONALS!! It is very rare to make the national tournament because it not only takes a strong team effort but also good health, unselfish play, strategy and most of all, brilliant leadership from the captain. Eagle Harbor was lucky enough to have their men's 3.5 55+ team go to nationals in 2015 captained by Jim Pinkerman. Here is Jim's story........

It was early January when Captain Jimmy Pinkerman and Co-Captain Joe Kelly started planning for their USTA season. As they put their roster together they began to realize that this could be a really good team. Many of the team members on the 3.5 level team had just turned or were soon to turn 55 so they had a relatively "young" team. They set a goal to

make it to the USTA National Championship, as they felt this was the team that could attain that goal.

Jimmy set up weekly clinics with Eagle Harbor Tennis Director Josh Vissman and staff tennis professional William Feliciano to improve their skills before and during the USTA season. When the season began, there was only one other 55+ men's team in the Jacksonville area. The team won their division locally and went to Daytona for the Sectional (State) Championship in early May. Facing 11 other teams, Eagle Harbor made it to the finals on the last day of competition. They played their final match and won two courts to one, advancing to the USTA National Championships in Surprise, AZ (Phoenix) over Halloween weekend.

Jimmy Pinkerman, Joe Kelly, Brad Robinson, Joe Thomas, Steve Andersen, Craig Price, Herb Quiñones, and Rick Sulzer attended the National Championship along with 16 other teams in their division and the Eagle Harbor team fared well as they finished 2-2.





- Shredded paper- should be placed in 13 gallon or smaller trash bags

PLASTIC (#1-#7)

- Plastic beverage and food containers
- Detergent bottles

GLASS

- Glass bottles and jars: green, brown and clear
- (Please place tops/lids in garbage. Labels do not need to be removed)

- Corrugated cardboard- flattened and cut into pieces 2' x 3' or smaller
- Newspapers
- Paperback books & telephone books
- Fiberboard boxes cereal, cracker and storage boxes
- CD's and CD cases
- Cleaning containers
- CARTONS food and beverage cartons including:
- Milk/creamer cartons
- Soup & broth cartons
- Juice boxes

METAL

- Beverage containers
- Steel and aluminum food containers
- Steel and aluminum cans
- Baking tins

Items **NOT** included in Recycling Program:

Plastic toys, plastic bags, clothes hangers, pizza boxes, motor oil containers, pool & other chemical containers, mirrors, window glass & broken glass, aerosol cans, electronics and pesticide containers.
