PRINCIPALS, TEACHERS, DISTRICT STAFF PROVIDE NORMALCY FOR STUDENTS

The first quarter of this school year has certainly been eventful, with not one but two hurricanes impacting our community. I am so grateful for the incredible work done by our principals, teachers, and district staff to provide as much normalcy as possible for our students.

We opened eight hurricane shelters, including Bartram Trail High School, during Hurricane Matthew. Our principals at these sites, supported by other principals and the maintenance staff at each, provided a safe place for almost 1000 people, including some very medically fragile residents. Then every school worked ceaselessly to open schools on Tuesday after the storm, allowing children to return to their routines and giving parents the ability to care for their own needs as well as help many, many in our community drastically affected by the storm.

My heartfelt gratitude goes to everyone who made a very difficult situation not only tolerable but uplifting. Thank you!

We experienced very little damage to our buildings, with the exception of our district office at 40 Orange Street. There was 13 inches of water in the first floor of this 115-year-old building. Renovation and repair will take 3-5 months to complete. However, the second and third floors were not damaged and will be back in service the week of October 17. Access to the building will be through the double steps at the front of the building.

The storm caused the School Board to cancel the groundbreaking for the new schools and the Nease expansion to a later date. Even though we have not had the ceremony, work is progressing on all the schools, including the K-8 in Aberdeen the K-8 in Nocatee, the new elementary in the World Golf Village area, and the Nease expansion. No new dates have been announced for the official groundbreaking, but I will share them as soon as they are available.

Another consequence of the storm was the delay in identifying a new superintendent for our schools. We have pushed the interview process to November 1-2, with a public reception on November 1 at First Coast Technical College, beginning at 6:00 PM.

Each candidate will introduce him/ herself, explaining why s/he would like to be our next superintendent and then respond to three questions. Following these presentations, the public will be able to meet the candidates during the reception time. On the morning of November 1, the Board will interview each of the four finalists, beginning at 8:15 am, also at FCTC. These interviews are open to the public.

On November 2, each Board member will have private interviews with the individual candidates. The Board will select the new superintendent at our November 8 regular meeting. The interview process has been moved to FCTC because of the damage to our district office.

I thank you again for your patience through all the natural disasters we have experienced this year.



Where you take your child in an emergency matters. Wolfson Children's Hospital has specially trained staff in all of its children's ERs, with new locations opening in 2016.



STAY VIGILANT, EVEN AFTER A STORM

As we are well into hurricane season I wanted remind everyone of basic safety tips and preparedness for storms.

I would also recommend checking out the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office website, sjso.org, which also has a lot of useful information and tips on not only hurricane preparedness, but on a host of other safety-related information.

Here are some general preparedness tips for a pending storm. Also, listed below are the two closest shelters in our area.

General Tips











Know where to go. If you are ordered to evacuate, know the local hurricane evacuation route(s) to take and have a plan for where you can stay. Contact your local emergency management agency for more information.

2 Put together a disaster supply kit, including a flashlight, batteries, cash, first aid supplies, and copies of your critical information if you need to evacuate

3 If you are not in an area that is advised to evacuate and you decide to stay in your home, plan for adequate supplies in case you lose power and water for several days and you are not able to leave due to flooding or blocked roads.

4 Make a family emergency communication plan.

5 Many communities have text or email alerting systems for emergency notifications. To find out what alerts are available in your area, search the Internet with your town, city, or county name and the word "alerts."



UNDERSTANDING HUNGER VS. CRAVINGS

Do you know the difference between feeling hungry and having a craving?

Hunger is a signal from your body that you are running low on fuel. You need to eat so you don't run out of energy. A craving, on the other hand, is an urge to eat for some other reason – not hunger.

Something triggers you and then you crave a certain food. Let's look at the difference between hunger and cravings a little more closely.

HUNGER

The feeling of hunger varies from one person to the next. One person may feel lightheaded and weak while another may feel grouchy. Here are some common signs of hunger:Growling pangs

- Cloudy thinking
- Trouble making decisions
- Feeling lightheaded or weak
- ■Headache
- ■Feeling sleepy
- Feeling grouchy

Hunger signals tend to be high in the morning after you first wake up. Does your body feel tired before you eat breakfast? Does your head feel cloudy early in the morning? These are all sign of hunger. Acraving is the desire for a certain food or flavor. For example, you might crave a hamburger or something salty. You might crave something sweet.

CRAVINGS

If you aren't hungry, but you want to eat, you are having a craving. Cravings are usually linked to thoughts and feelings. Someone who feels lonely might crave fond memories of being cared for as a child. Someone else might crave ice cream when it is hot. Someone else might respond to a TV ad. The food may look tasty or portray an appealing way of life.

KNOWING WHAT TO EAT: Before eating a meal or snack, as yourself these questions:

 Am I hungry?
 If I am not hungry, then why do I want to eat?


