

For many, the winter holidays are a time of joy, celebration and tradition. Decorating your home, yard or office is a fun, festive way to celebrate the season. A little planning can help you enjoy your display all season long.

Planning your Holiday Display

- Avoid overloading electrical outlets.
- Use lights that have been tested for safety look for a certification mark from UL,
 CSA, ETL or other nationally-recognized laboratories. Consider using LED lights when possible they run cooler, use less energy and last longer than incandescent lights.
- Never exceed the maximum number of strings or devices that may be linked together, as indicated on decoration packaging.

Decorating Safely

- Make sure decorations are well-ventilated, protected from weather and a safe distance away from flammable items.
- Use wooden or fiberglass ladders when putting up electrical décor and lights outside as metal ladders conduct electricity.
- Unplug electric lights, devices and decorations before installing or replacing bulbs, changing parts or attempting other repairs.
- Secure lights, decorations and cords to prevent wind damage. Never staple, nail through or fasten electrical wires or extensions cords in any way that might damage the wire or insulation. This could cause electrical shock or fire.

During the Holidays

- Turn off all lights and electrical decorations before leaving your home or office, or going to bed.
- If possible, use battery-operated candles in place of traditional candles to avoid the hazards of an open flame. If you choose to light candles, place them away from flammable or combustible materials, including other decorations, fabrics, plastic or paper products.
- Do not put candles in places where they might be easily knocked over, and never leave a lit candle unattended.
- Extinguish all candles before leaving a room or going to bed.



Use the Aberdeen website: http://www.floridianpmcommunities.com/aberdeen/ to locate governing documents which include the covenants and restrictions along with the architectural guidelines and application.

Below please see a few of the covenants and restrictions that may be most helpful for you to know about.

- All lawns must be maintained to present a neat, clean and well-kept appearance. Routine lawn maintenance to include but not limited to mowing, edging, trimming of shrubbery, fertilization, irrigation, and weeding of flower beds should be conducted weekly during the spring and summer, and biweekly during the fall and winter, or as required given growth of vegetation and foliage.
- Please refrain from blowing grass cuttings or leaves into the roadway. Lose grass, leaves and similar types of impediments hazard bicyclist and other two-wheeled vehicles, and create obstructions to rain and storm water runoff. All storm drains should be kept free and clear of all yard waste and debris.
- Lawns should be kept free of weeds and other unsightly vegetation. Dead sod and or patches of bare earth should be replaced. All flower beds must be mulched, and kept free of weeds. All trees and shrubs must be kept trimmed and free of dead plant material.
- Boats, trailers, watercraft, and other types of recreational vehicles are NOT permitted to parked or stored upon any lot unless screened from public view by a privacy fence approved through the Architectural Control Committee. Recreational vehicles may be parked in the driveway for forty-eight (48) hours or less for the purpose of loading or unloading with advanced notice to the Association management company.
- Commercial vehicles shall not be parked or kept on property.
- Refrain from blocking sidewalks period. The blocking of sidewalk hazards pedestrians and is an endangerment to any passersby.
- Parking on the grass is prohibited. Do not park on the grass of any parcel, private lot or common area.
- Please be keep your resident, driveway, and walkways from of mold and mildew by regularly pressure washing or similarly treating your property.
- Trash cans should not be placed on the curb earlier than 6pm the evening before the respective trash or recycling collection day. The trash cans should be returned to a storage location in the garage, or rear or side yard screened from view, no later than 6pm the day of collection. Trash Cans and recycle bins must be stored in the garage or an approved trash enclosure only.
- All dogs must be on a leash and under the control of the owner at all times. Dogs are not permitted to be tethered or left unattended. **Owners are responsible to pick up after the pets**. Dog dropping should not be left on private lots, and or upon any common area.
- Any improvement to the property must be submitted to the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) for review and consideration prior to project start or installation. The required forms for submission of ACC applications may be found on the website listed above.
- Mailboxes and post requirements are listed in the Architectural Guidelines- Exhibit C
- ♦ Keep car doors locked be aware of suspicious activity. Call police at the non- emergency number if in doubt. Non-emergency St. Johns County Sheriff 904-824-8304.

New Year's Eve is one of the most joyful holidays celebrated. We have the chance to celebrate the year we are leaving behind with loved once as well as welcoming in the challenges of the year to come. Unfortunately, during a holiday with such celebration there are many dangerous. With these 5 New Year's safety tips, you can be better prepared for the dangers and enjoy a more fun holiday.

Don't Drink and Drive

This first one is obvious for a reason. Drinking and driving is not only dangerous to yourself but also everyone else in the vicinity of your vehicle. It should come as no surprise that January 1st has the highest percent of deaths related to alcohol, according to Insurance Institute for Highway Safety data. Between 2007 and 2011, 42 percent of all traffic deaths during the holiday were directly caused by alcohol. You can even help prevent others from making this fatal mistake. If you notice an intoxicated friend planning on driving, suggest other methods such as Uber.

Plan a Sober Ride

Drinking during New Years is not uncommon and you shouldn't stop yourself because of the dangerous drinking and driving statistics. Instead, plan for a sober ride if you intend on drinking. Ask a sober friend or family member for a ride. Take an Uber, Lyft or even an old fashion cab if that is your preferred method. You can even take a bus or train depending on where you live. Even in your sober ride, act appropriately to allow your driving to pay full attention to the driving. Although your driver may be sober, it is likely there is another driver near that is not. Alcohol related auto accidents are highest between the hours of 8:00pm – 2:00am.

Be Aware of your Surroundings

It is unfortunate but during a holiday that is notorious for a lot of people going out and drinking, there are individuals that will take advantage of this situation. Make sure your cell phone is fully charged before leaving your house so you are able to stay in contact with someone. Try to travel in crowds with at least a few people you know and never accept a drink from a stranger. Most importantly, don't be afraid to say something. If you feel uncomfortable with someone and think they may be a danger to you, alert the authority. Even if police are not present where you are, most places with large crowds require professional security.

Beware of Fireworks

Fireworks are fun and pretty to look at but they can be extremely dangerous, not to mention possibly illegal. Depending on your state, lighting any firework could be illegal but that doesn't stop individuals from crossing state lines to purchase them. Even if someone else is lighting a firework on your property, you can be help criminally liable if any damage or injuries occur. If you plan on allowing fireworks, make sure your pets are inside. If you want them outside with you during the festivities at least check your fence for security and that they have on a collar with a tag. Consider getting a microchip for your pet as well. It may seem unnecessary now but you will be happy you did it when they go missing.

Eat Dinner

This may seem like an odd suggestion and you may be concerned about wanting to look good in a certain outfit but avoiding alcohol poisoning is much more important. Foods high in protein such as cheese, meat and nuts are particularly important. These types of food will slow down the absorption of alcohol in the digestive system. This will give the alcohol more time to metabolize in the body resulting in a lower risk or alcohol poising. Our liver metabolizes about one alcoholic drink per hour. A good rule of thumb is a 12 oz. beer = 4-5 oz. of wine = 1.5 oz. of hard liquor. By sipping a drink rather than chugging it, your body will have more time to metabolize the alcohol which will result in less of a hangover. You can also consider snaking on nuts while drinking if possible.



Non-Sufficient Fund Policy
