

Curb Appeal Counts

There are many things that residents can do which cost little or no money and go a long way toward maintaining our beautiful Black Creek streetscape:

- Store trash cans/bags where they will be out of view until the evening before trash, lawn debris and/or recycling are to be picked up and promptly return containers to their stored location out of view of passers by.
- Cleaning out and sprucing up your vard are good lowcost alternatives to major home improvement. Whether you hire a professional or have the skills and tools to do it yourself, here are some tips to improve your lawn and landscape:
 - Weed, edge, and mulch planting beds.
- Plant colorful annuals in beds or pots around the house and patio, in hanging plant holders or in flower boxes.
 - To solve problems or add interest, plant new trees and

shrubs to create focus areas, or to camouflage foundations and old fencing, or block unsightly views.

- Have your trees and shrubs professionally pruned, fix brown spots in the lawn and remove and replace diseased/ dving plants.

Please keep in mind that any exterior home improvements including but not limited to, exterior color change, exterior concrete change, fencing, pool and screen enclosures, room additions as well as large landscaping renovations and/or tree removal all require the prior approval of the Black Creek Architectural Review Committee (ARC).

The Lifeguarding program of the American Red Cross Lifeguarding course is to provide entry-level lifeguard participants with the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize and respond to aquatic emergencies and to provide professionallevel care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries and sudden illnesses until emergency medical services (EMS) personnel take over. It trains lifeguards to act with speed and confidence in emergency situations both in and out of the water. This program reflects the 2017 Lifeguarding course. Participants must be able to pass a pre-course swim evaluation and attend every scheduled session to become certified. Participants must be at least 15 years of age by the first of class.







School is out for the summer and bicycles and golf carts will be on the roadways. Last month we discussed bicycle safety, so this month let's review some safety tips and requirements for golf carts and low speed vehicles. One other reminder for bicyclists before we cover golf carts. Remember to lock your bicycle up when you leave it unattended. There have been several unlocked bicycles stolen in Eagle Harbor. If you like it, Lock it!

Operation of Golf Carts and Low-Speed Vehicles in Eagle Harbor

Eagle Harbor is one of the few communities in Clay County that are fortunate enough to be approved for Golf Cart use on the roads of our community. While this is one of several wonderful amenities that we enjoy, it is very important that laws that govern the use of golf carts be followed to maintain resident safety. Most of the laws governing Golf Carts are contained in Florida Statute (FS) 316.212. They are in place to keep you safe when using a golf cart or Low speed vehicle.

Summer is here and it's time to get those golf carts ready! Florida summers are known for their natural beauty, beaches, and, of course, the weather. It's fun in the sun and what better way to travel with in Eagle Harbor than on your golf cart. Have as much fun as you can, but it's important that you and your friends and family stay safe.

A common misperception of a Golf Cart is that due to its low speed, it is a relatively safe vehicle. However, when operated outside of the laws, it can present hazardous conditions that may result in serious injury.

Sixteen Golf Cart Guidelines to keep you safe

- 1. Never drive recklessly or joy ride. Drive courteously. Obey all vehicle traffic laws and rules of the road.
- Never drive intoxicated or under the influence of any drug or narcotic.
- 3. Avoid distractions while operating the golf cart just as you would in an automobile. Be safe and attentive -- avoid talking, texting, or reading while driving, reaching for objects, applying makeup, or eating.
- 4. Golf carts should be equipped with seat belts for driver and all passengers. The driver and all occupants should utilize available seatbelts anytime the vehicle is in use.
- 5. Only carry the number of passengers for which there are seats
- 6. Drivers and all passengers should keep all body parts (arms, legs, feet) inside cart while vehicle is in motion, except when signaling a turn.
- 7. Do not allow anyone to ride standing in the vehicle or on the back platform of the vehicle. Do not put vehicle in motion until all passengers are safely seated inside vehicle.
 - 8. Operate the vehicle from the driver's side only.
- 9. Always use hand signals to indicate your intent to turn due to the small size and limited visibility of the turn signals on a golf cart.
- 10. Check blind spots before turning. When making a left-hand turn, yield to the thru traffic lane and merge into the left lane

before turning left. Never make a left-hand turn from the right lane. Be very careful when making the left turn from Eagle Harbor Parkway to enter the swim park parking lot. This is a dangerous intersection, so be extremely cautious.

- 11. When backing up, turn and look behind your golf cart, don't just rely on the rear-view mirror.
- 12. Avoid sharp turns at maximum speed and drive straight up and down slopes to reduce the risk of passenger ejections and/or rollover. Avoid excessive speed, sudden starts, stops and fast turns.
- 13. Reduce speed due to driving conditions, especially when driving on the road shoulder or other inclines or declines, blind corners, intersections, pedestrians, and during inclement weather.
- 14. Do not leave keys in golf cart while unattended and make sure the selector is in neutral, and the parking brake is set.
- 15. Always yield to pedestrians and be cognizant of motor vehicles.
- 16. Use extreme caution in inclement weather. Although a golf cart can be operated in the rain, it is best not to, since visibility is reduced.

Remember a golf cart operator must be fourteen (14) years or older, speed limit for a golf cart is 20 mph, but they should normally be operated at 15 mph or less.

Golf carts are not to be operated in Eagle Harbor after sunset even if equipped with head and taillights.

Golf Carts that operate at speeds up to 25 mph are classified as Low Speed Vehicles (LSV) and must be operated by a licensed driver, must be registered with the State of Florida, and be insured just like your automobile.

In addition to the Golf Cart Florida laws, the CDD requires that all Golf Carts and Low Speed Vehicles register with Eagle Harbor prior to operating on District property. Registration is free and can be done by making an appointment at (904) 621-8363. Upon completing your registration, you will receive two number decals to adhere to the front and back of your vehicle. Low Speed Vehicles will receive different color decals. A copy of your current Eagle Harbor registration must always be on file. Failure to register may result in suspension of user privileges of the facilities and amenities. VIPS when on patrol encountering an unregistered golf cart will provide the operator with the registration forms and request that they contact the CDD registration office at (904) 621-8363.

We are always looking for volunteers to help and if you'd like more information contact the Eagle Harbor VIPS coordinator Walt Joba at: waltjoba@comcast.net Volunteer opportunities are not limited to patrolling the neighborhood, but include varied duties such as marine patrol, Crime newsletter, filing reports at the jail, and working in the various units that comprise the sheriff's office. Also, we want to thank the CDD Board and the Eagle Harbor Golf Club for allowing us to use the "Cart Barn" to store our carts. Without their support we wouldn't be able to provide the patrol services that we do.





Hurricane Preparedness

Here in Florida we enjoy mild winters and hot summers. Unfortunately, we also experience hurricane season and no one can forget the effect Irma had on this area.

Modernization in weather reporting means we have plenty of time to prepare ourselves but there's more we can do to save ourselves from damage or mountains of cleanup.

Please trim all dead palm fronds, these are the first things to get blown down in high winds. It's also advisable to trim branches that hang over your home and to remove all dead trees. Be sure your chimney is in good repair and take care of any roof leaks.

Do a little preparation for evacuation in case that becomes necessary. Make sure you have a full tank of gas and some cash in case ATM's are not working. If you will be evacuating with pets, find out ahead of time which shelters allow them and what you will need to bring for their comfort. If you have a family member that will need special help or is on oxygen, find out which shelters have special needs services.

We've learned that we are not impervious to a loss of power. Be sure you have a sufficient stock of batteries, food that does not need refrigeration, a manual can opener, and any medications you can't afford to run out of. If you have a generator, be sure you have sufficient fuel for a few days and remember to NEVER run it in an enclosed area.

Should there be an impending storm, take the recommended safeguards advised by your TV weather news crews. Eagle Harbor was built for a 100-year flood and we are situated well

Any man 55 years of age or older who is a Patron or a GHIN Member of the Eagle Harbor Golf Club is invited to join us.

Each month we field an eight-man team to compete against select clubs in the Jacksonville area over an eleven-month season.

The venues sequence through fifteen or more courses, including neutral (non-league) clubs, such as Deerwood, Palencia, and Ponte Vedra Inn for the season-ending championship.

Briefly put, your first three matches are played off your USGA Handicap Index. Thereafter, like everyone else, you play against a league index based on the best three of your most recent six league scores, adjusted for equitable stroke control. The format is net Stableford, as specified in USGA Rule 32-1b, whereby points are awarded for net scores of bogey, par, birdie, eagle and double eagle: 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 points, respectively.

Each team member plays in a four-man group with fellow competitors from three different clubs. The pairings are randomly assigned. So, you are as likely to play with a 2 handicapper as with a 30 handicapper. No matter, since everyone is playing against his own handicap, which guarantees a level playing field.

A monthly signup sheet is posted on the bulletin board in the golf shop. A random drawing determines the roster when more than eight players sign up. For more information, call 269-9300!
